ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF THE
PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN CHINATOWN
(UNITED PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA)

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we, the undersigned, citizens and residents of the State of California, have voluntarily associated ourselves together and do hereby associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a non-profit corporation under Title I, Division 2, Part 1, of the Corporation Code of the State of California, which does not contemplate the distribution of gains, profits, or dividends to the members thereof, and we hereby state:

FIRST--The name of this corporation shall be PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN CHINATOWN (UNITED PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA).

SECOND--Said corporation is organized and operated exclusively for religious and charitable purposes. It is not organized or operated for profit and no part of its net earnings shall inure to the benefit of any private individual or member thereof.

THIRD--The specific and primary purpose for which said corporation is formed is to facilitate the management of the temporalities of the religious and charitable activities of the Presbyterian Church in Chinatown (United Presbyterian Church in the United States of America), an unincorporated religious association, which is affiliated with and under the religious principles and beliefs of the United Presbyterian Church in the United States of America.

FOURTH--Said corporation shall exercise and have all the rights and powers granted to non-profit corporations, under the provisions of Title I, Division 2, Part 1, of the Corporation Code of the State of California and shall have the power to do all necessary or incidental acts in the furtherance of its religious and charitable purposes except as otherwise provided by the Articles of Incorporation or the By-laws of the State of California. Notwithstanding any of the above statements of purposes and powers, this corporation shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activities or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the primary purpose of this corporation.

FIFTH--The principal office for the transaction of the business of the corporation shall be located in the county of San Francisco, State of California.

SIXTH--The governing board of directors of this corporation shall be called the Board of Trustees. The number of Trustees may be fixed or changed from time to time by the By-laws of said corporation. The names and addresses of the persons who are to act in the capacity of Trustees until the selection of their successors are:



SEVENTH--The members of said corporation shall be such persons who conform to and qualify under the regulations to be designated in the By-laws of the corporation and said members shall have such rights and powers as are provided therein.


EIGHTH--The property of this corporation is irrevocably dedicated to religious or charitable purposes, and upon the liquidation, dissolution or abandonment of its owner, will not inure to the benefit of any trustee, officer or member thereof or to the benefit of any private person or persons, but shall be distributed to and become the property of one or more of such constituent organizations of the United Presbyterian Church in the United States of America which has established their tax-exempt status under Section 501 (c) (3); but if not then in existence or exempt, to another organization which is organized and operated exclusively for religious and charitable purposes and which has established its tax exempt status under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of the United States.

NINTH--The name of the existing unincorporated association which is hereby being incorporated is PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN CHINATOWN (UNITED PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA).

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the president and secretary of the Presbyterian Church in Chinatown (United Presbyterian Church in the United States of America), have hereunto set their hands this 15th day of February, 1972.

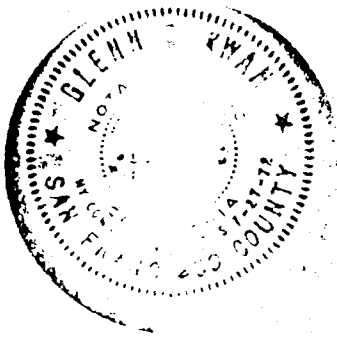
