This Sunday at PCC

Sermon: On the Second Sunday after Epiphany, we hear John the Baptist's bold declaration: "Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world." In a culture that often imagines faith as a form of spiritual warfare or political power, this sermon invites us to rediscover the Reformed vision of Jesus—not as a culture warrior, but as the sacrificial Lamb whose love transforms the world. Drawing on Isaiah's Servant Song and the Gospel of John, we will explore how Christ's mission challenges Christian Nationalist ideals and calls us instead to humility, witness, and faithful discipleship.
